About the Seminar:

Tiered dispute resolution provisions for mediation, expert determination, neutral evaluation and/or adjudication are now commonplace in many standard form contracts where they are deployed in conjunction with arbitration. To what extent are they enforceable in the event a party to such contracts refuses to comply but proceeds with arbitration? This seminar explores the enforceability of such contract provisions or agreements in Singapore and its impact on arbitration; as well as other issues concerning the co-existence and co-ordination of other dispute resolution mechanisms in conjunction with arbitration.
