Leslie Chew SC is a practicing lawyer of more than 26 years. After practicing at the Bar for 26 years, Leslie was appointed a District Judge in 2007 and Senior District Judge in 2009. After spending almost 7 years in the judiciary, he returned to private practice in May 2014. He was appointed a Senior Counsel in 2000. He is a Professorial Fellow of the Singapore Institute of Legal Education where he is the Subject Coordinator and Examiner for the Law and Practice of Arbitration as part of the Bar Examinations.

He is a Fellow of the Chartered and Singapore Institutes of Arbitrators. Leslie has sat both as a sole Arbitrator and as part of a tribunal in ICC, SIAC and ad hoc arbitrations both in Singapore and abroad. He is the author of the 'Law and Practice of Arbitration in

Singapore' (LexisNexis, 2010). Leslie has also taught trial advocacy to the local Bar as well as lawyers in other jurisdictions for many years. He was one of the early Singapore lawyers to train with the National Institute of Trial Advocacy (NITA) in the USA. More recently, he was part of the faculty in the Singapore Advanced Advocacy Course 2014, which is modelled on the International Advanced Advocacy Course, Keeble College, Oxford.
